
BECAUSE OF YOU

ACF has provided combat and non-combat related rehabilitation to several Air Force Special Operators at the Andrews Institute (EXOS), where prescribed therapy is not always covered under TRICARE and other related funding was exhausted. Additionally, the foundation provided medical travel and temporary living assistance to the wife and children of an airman on a life-saving transplant list, as well as equipment for a service member with cognitive difficulties from a combat related Traumatic Brain Injury. This equipment enabled the service member to complete a higher level of education, despite severe visual impairment.
